





D.El.Ed PROGRAMME

St Joseph TTI for Women, a self-financing institution, ventured into the field of Elementary teacher education since 2005 has been consistently endeavoring to raise the pedagogical and transactional skills of the teacher trainees. Providing exposure to the innovative ways of teaching is the forte. The college offers 2 yea (4 semesters) D.El.Ed Programme in unaided self-financing scheme with an annual intake of 50 seats.





The college adopts the admission procedure for the academic Programmes, adhering to the rules and regulations of the regulatory bodies namely NCTE, Mahatma Gandh University and the State Government.

The rules and eligibility of admission for Programmes offered by the college are as follows



B. Ed Programme

- Admission is through the single window system CAP of the Mahatma Gandhi University.
- Candidates are admitted to the course on the basis of merit and the minimum requirement of marks for admission to B. Ed Programmes is 50% (CGPA of 2 out of 4) in Bachelor's Degree (Science/ Arts subjects) for part III or in aggregate 50 % Marks in M.A/ M.Sc./ M.com.
- Candidates should have passed the corresponding Degree Examination under the 10 + 2 + 3pattern with one core/main subject and two complementary/subsidiary subjects from any of the Universities in Kerala or of any other University recognized by Mahatma Gandhi University equivalent thereto for admission, subject to the stipulation regarding marks.
- Candidates who have passed Degree examination with Double/Triple main are eligible for admission to B Ed in any of the subjects they have studied as their Core/main. However, they have to submit copy of the Equivalency/Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University, stating that, their Qualifying Examination is recognized for seeking admission to the relevant B, Ed Degree Course(s) as applicable, at the time of admission. This provision is not applicable in the case of those applicants who have passed their qualifying examination from MG University.

Admission || B. Ed Programme

- Candidates who have undergone five year Integrated Programme in Science/Arts are also eligible for admission for B.Ed. They have to submit programme wise eligibility / equivalency certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University stating that, their Qualifying Examination is recognized for St. Joseph College Of Teacher Education For Women, Ernakulam seeking admission to the relevant B Ed Degree Course(s) as applicable, at the time of admission.
- B.A./B.Sc. (Hon) Degree course in the subjects concerned are eligible for B. Ed degree admission.
- Relaxation in marks is provided to the eligible candidates as notified in the prospectus of the University.
- Intake of seats: The college has an intake of 2 units (100 seats), of which 85 are merit seats which are filled from the applications submitted to the Mahatma Gandhi University. The remaining 15 seats are seats are earmarked as Management Quota seats and these seats shall be filled by the Educational Agency. Both merit and management seats applicants have to submit their applications to the CAP Mahatma Gandhi University. The applicants seeking admission in the Management quota shall also submit their application to the college authorities.
- Age limit: There is no age limit for applying to B Ed programme.



🔰 M. Ed Programme

- From 2015 onwards the students to the M. Ed programme are admitted by the college direct as per the prospectus issued by the University for each academic year following Government Reservation policy.
- Candidates seeking admission to the M.Ed. programme should have obtained at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade in the following programmes-
 - (i) B.Ed.
 - (ii) B.A. B.Ed., B.Sc. B.Ed.
 - (iii) B.El.Ed
 - (iv) D.El.Ed with an under graduate degree(with 50% marks in each).
- The college has an intake of 1 Unit (50 seats) . 50% of the seats are earmarked as Management Quota seats and these seats shall be filled by the educational agency. The applicants in this category shall submit their application to the college authorities where the candidate seeks management quota admission The remaining 50% seats are merit seats. The merit seats include the reservation seats for SC/ST/SEBC/EWS/Sports/Teacher Quota and PC Quota. The application for merit seats also have to be submitted at the college concerned.
- Age Limit: There is no age limit for applying M. Ed programme.
- Fees: As per univeristy norms.



D.El.Ed Programme

- Admissions to the D.El.Ed Course in the college is in compliance with the rules and regulation of the regulatory bodies namely NCTE and the State Government.
- The admissions for the D.El.Ed Course are notified by the Department of General Education, Govt. of Kerala. The application form duly filled along with photocopies of mark lists and a fe need to be submitted to the Deputy Director of Education of the district (Merit Seat) or to th principal of the college (Management Seat).
- The college has an intake of 50 seats, of which 25 are merit seats which are filled from the applications submitted to the Deputy Director of Education. The remaining 25 seats are filled by the management from the applications submitted at the college. There are different application forms for both merit and management seats.
- Qualification Required: Candidates who have obtained 50% in the Higher Secondary Examination or its equivalent are eligible to apply. Candidate should not have taken more tha three chances to pass the Higher Secondary Examination. Relaxation stipulated by the Govt a applicable to candidates with reservation. Of the total seats 40% is reserved for science,40% 1 Humanities and 20% for Commerce.
- Age Limit: Candidates must have completed 17 years and should not exceed 33 years. Relaxation stipulated by the Govt are applicable to candidates with reservation.
- Fees: As per univeristy norms.
