

The Indian curriculum and school curriculums abroad varies on many aspects. One of the very important aspect is that on comparing Indian curriculum with the abroad one, the abroad curriculum is much more innovative and creative than the Indian curriculum. The Indian curriculum is mainly have a theoretical approach whereas the abroad education takes a


more practical approach. The manner in which the abroad curriculum deal with and apply the concepts has a considerable impact on making pupils grasp and apply the principles they learn in real life circumstances. The Indian curriculum help students gain knowledge base on the concepts than experience. The education system in India is governed by many curricula and school education bodies. These firms establish syllabi, tools, and standardized tests based on the National Curriculum Framework. Such firms include The Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), and the Kerala State Education Board (KSEB). International schools either follow a worldwide curriculum (such as the International Baccalaureate, Cambridge International Examinations or Edexcel) or a distinct national curriculum that differs from Indian curricula. Dr. Ashokan Nochad mentioned all of the aspects of the curriculum in India and abroad in detail pointing out its advantages and disadvantages. He gave special attention to the learning process and learning outputs along with effective teaching aids for better teaching-learning experience. Dr. Ashokan Nochad reminded all of the student teachers to be aware of such diversities in curriculum in India and abroad since it has greater relevance in their profession. After the session, feedbacks were collected from the participants via Google Forms. Majority of the students had a great experience and gave positive feedbacks. They suggested for more such programmes organized for them and some of them even suggested the webinar would have been more effective if it was conducted offline. The entire programme winded up at 9.00 PM with the vote of thanks delivered by Ms. Anu P Thomas, student teacher from Physical Science optional.

The webinar on 'Diversities in School Curriculum in India and Abroad' was extremely informative and fruitful for the student teachers. The student teachers could enhance their knowledge and got an overall idea about school curriculums which would positively contribute to their effective performance in their one month induction programme in the second semester. 





The educational system must prepare pupils to be lifelong learners, scholars, innovators educators and researchers. Despite significant and steady economic progress over the last few decades, India still has socioeconomic issues, and boosting education is the only future ahead to overcome these obstacles and strengthen the country's economic growth. The effective implementation of National Policy for Education 2020 has the ability to bring about significant changes through revamping the Indian educational system. The National Council for Educational Research and Training (NCERT) is the national institution that creates programs and policies, as well as curriculum frameworks and standards that are followed by respective state SCERTs. The National Policy on Education, 1986 and the 1992 Programme of Action both envisioned compulsory and free education of adequate quality for all children under the age of 14. While the legislation secured education for all, the education system's core problems remained, impeding the advancement of the education system of India to the global scale. The New Education Policy in 2020 established numerous reforms in the education system of India. The new Ministry of Education is committed towards improving the educational system. While

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concentrating on many aspects of education, the policy also aims at bridging the gap between technology and education.

The National Education Policy or NEP 2020 envisions a systemic and inclusive transformation in the education systems. It focuses on 'Equitable and Inclusive Education,' which reflects the idea that no children should be denied educational opportunities regardless of their background or socio-cultural characteristics. It has considered the problems of the Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDGs), which include female and transgender people, Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes, minorities, Other Backward Communities (OBCs) and other categories. This strategy strives to address the social category disparities in school education participation, access and learning outcomes. As part of the National Population Education Project (NPEP), the NCERT is conducting the Adolescent Education Programme (AEP). The key learning outcomes of Adolescent Education Programme is to make learners aware of adolescent problems, such as the development process during adolescence and HIV/AIDS, and to instill in them a constructive attitude towards these concerns. Furthermore, gender-inclusive comprehensive and integrated education is completely covered through age-appropriate incorporation in diverse textual materials in the school curriculum, as well as resource and training materials on wellness and health of school-going Children, particularly under the aegis of the SHP or School Health Programme under Ayushman Bharat scheme. Furthermore, the NEP 2020 recognizes transgender students as socioeconomically marginalized groups and ensures equal and quality education for all such pupils. This includes provisions to help transgender children gain access to education, as well as assistance for community-based programs that tackle local situation-specific barriers to transgender children's participation and access to in education, with the goal of eliminating any remaining disparities in educational opportunities (including vocational courses) for children of any gender or other marginalized groups. Despite its challenges, National Education Policy 2020, however attempts to solve several deficiencies in India's education system, and with this policy, India is projected to attain the SDG (Sustainable Development Goal) of 2030 by delivering equitable and inclusive quality education. The seminar winded up at 12.30 PM with the vote of thanks delivered by Ms. Akhitha Sebastian, student teacher from second year Natural Science optional.
