The institution dedicated to St. Joseph is established, owned and run by the Vimala Province of the Congregation of the Mother of Carmel (CMC). CMC is a religious and charitable association of a religious minority group within the purview of the constitution of India (CMC Con.No.002). CMC is the first indigenous congregation for women in the Syro-Malabar Church founded on February 13th 1866. 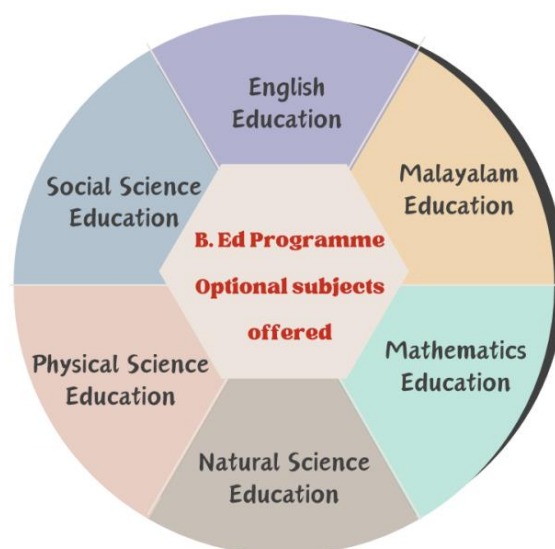


# Academic Programmes

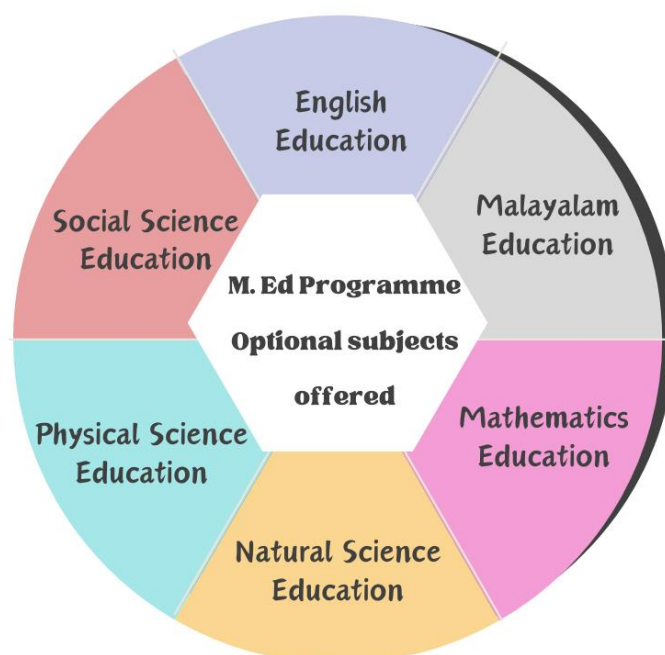

# Admission

The college adopts the admission procedure for the academic Programmes, adhering to the rules and regulations of the regulatory bodies namely NCTE, Mahatma Gandhi University and the State Government.

**The rules and eligibility of admission for Programmes offered by the college are as follows:**



## **B. Ed Programme**

- ❖ Admission is through the single window system CAP of the Mahatma Gandhi University. Candidates are admitted to the course on the basis of merit and the minimum requirement of marks for admission to B. Ed Programmes is 50% (CGPA of 2 out of 4) in Bachelor's Degree (Science/ Arts subjects) for part III or in aggregate 50 % Marks in M.A/ M.Sc. / M.com.
- ❖ Candidates should have passed the corresponding Degree Examination under the 10 + 2+ 3 pattern with one core/main subject and two complementary/subsidiary subjects from any of the Universities in Kerala or of any other University recognized by Mahatma Gandhi University equivalent thereto for admission, subject to the stipulation regarding marks.
- ❖ Candidates who have passed Degree examination with Double/Triple main are eligible for admission to B Ed in any of the subjects they have studied as their Core/main. However, they have to submit copy of the Equivalency/Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University, stating that, their Qualifying Examination is recognized for seeking admission to the relevant B. Ed Degree Course(s) as applicable, at the time of admission. This provision is not applicable in the case of those applicants who have passed their qualifying examination from MG University.

- ❖ Candidates who have undergone five year Integrated Programme in Science/ Arts are also eligible for admission for B.Ed. They have to submit programme wise eligibility / equivalency certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University stating that, their Qualifying Examination is recognized for St. Joseph College Of Teacher Education For Women, Ernakulam seeking admission to the relevant B Ed Degree Course(s) as applicable, at the time of admission.
- ❖ B.A. /B.Sc. (Hon) Degree course in the subjects concerned are eligible for B. Ed degree admission.
- ❖ Relaxation in marks is provided to the eligible candidates as notified in the prospectus of the University.
- ❖ Intake of seats: The College has an intake of 2 units (100 seats), of which 85 are merit seats which are filled from the applications submitted to the Mahatma Gandhi University. The remaining 15 seats are seats are earmarked as Management Quota seats and these seats shall be filled by the Educational Agency. Both merit and management seats applicants have to submit their applications to the CAP Mahatma Gandhi University. The applicants seeking admission in the Management quota shall also submit their application to the college authorities.
- ❖ Age limit: There is no age limit for applying to B Ed programme.
- ❖ Fees: As per University norms.



## **M. Ed Programme**

- ❖ From 2015 onwards the students to the M. Ed programme are admitted by the college directly as per the prospectus issued by the University for each academic year following Government Reservation policy.
- ❖ Candidates seeking admission to the M.Ed. programme should have obtained at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade in the following programmes:
  - B.Ed.
  - B.A. B.Ed., B.Sc. B.Ed.
  - D.El.Ed
  - D.El.Ed with an under graduate degree (with 50% marks in each).
- ❖ The college has an intake of 1 Unit (50 seats). 50% of the seats are earmarked as Management Quota seats and these seats shall be filled by the educational agency. The applicants in this category shall submit their application to the college authorities where the candidate seeks management quota admission and the remaining 50% seats are merit seats. The merit seats include the reservation seats for SC/ST/SEBC/EWS/Sports/Teacher Quota and PD Quota. The application for merit seats also have to be submitted at the college concerned.
- ❖ Age Limit: There is no age limit for applying M. Ed programme. Fees: As per University norms.

# *Statutory Committees*



## ❖ **SC/ ST Monitoring Cell**

It was established by St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam to ensure that the college is complying with all of the government's policies and regulations regarding the admission, retention, and progress of Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) students. The cell is also responsible for providing support services to SC/ST students, such as scholarships, counseling, and remedial classes.

## ❖ **Minority Cell**

The cell aims to create an atmosphere of equal opportunity through awareness generation programmes and to provide auxiliary support towards skill development and enhancing the employability of students.

## ❖ **Student Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC)**

A Grievance Redressal Cell is functioning in the Institution as per UGC norms and modified and updated from time to time. Currently Grievance Redressal Cell of the Institution function as per F.No.14-4/2012 (CPP) of October 2018. Students may approach the cell to voice their grievances regarding academic matters, health services, library, and other services. Any form of discontent or dissatisfaction on the part of the students can be informed to the cell. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the Convenor or staff in charge of the Grievance cell. Grievances may also be sent through e-mail to the Convenor of the Grievance Cell. The cell then redresses the grievances promptly and judiciously. As a result of this mechanism, the institute has a pleasant ambient atmosphere and good work culture with in-built goodwill and mutual understanding among the students.

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### ❖ **Internal Complaint Committee**

Internal Complaints Committee deals with issues regarding sexual harassment. It works for the prevention of sexual harassment to maintain safe environment for students and staff.

### ❖ **Anti - Ragging Cell**

The institution is committed in providing a safe and healthy learning environment for students. Anti-ragging Committee and Anti-ragging Squad were constituted according to UGC guidelines. The institution is of the policy that no act of ragging, major or minor, shall go unnoticed. No ragger, student or non-student, shall go unpunished.

### ❖ **OBC Cell**

The Cell plays a crucial role in fostering a safe and secure environment for all students and staff.

### ❖ **Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell**

The cell is aimed at achieving gender equality, removal of gender bias or discrimination, sexual harassment and other acts of gender based violence.

### ❖ **Anti-Narcotic Club**

It undertakes programmes to develop awareness against Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS). The cell organizes awareness programmes against drug abuse in Schools, Colleges Community.



#### ❖ **Social Service Club**

This club is a community-based organization or group that focuses on engaging in activities and initiatives aimed at improving the well-being and welfare of individuals, communities, or specific causes. These clubs often operate on a volunteer basis and are dedicated to serving others, addressing social issues, and making a positive impact on society.

#### ❖ **Eco Club**

This club stands as a vibrant hub of sustainability enthusiasts, aiming to instil eco-consciousness among students and the community. With a focus on fostering environmental awareness, the club specialises in organising eco-friendly initiatives, advocating for sustainable practices, and engaging in activities that promote conservation, recycling, and renewable energy adoption. Its primary objectives revolve around nurturing a culture of environmental responsibility, educating members on ecological matters, and spearheading projects that contribute to a greener and more sustainable campus and beyond.

#### ❖ **Women Cell**

This club focuses on promoting gender equality, women's empowerment, and creating a safe and inclusive environment for women students and staff. The main goal of a Women's Cell is to address gender-related issues, provide support to women, and raise awareness about gender rights and issues. Activities include campaigns for raising awareness organizing seminars and workshops on themes connected to women's rights, gender equality, and other relevant topics; giving female students and employees a forum for discussion and advice on matters relating to harassment, discrimination, and other gender-related issues, conducting training sessions on leadership, career development, self-defence, and personal empowerment, Information is provided regarding women's legal rights, relevant channels for redress, and



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available resources for support, establishing initiatives to educate the university community as a whole about gender stereotypes, biases, and the value of respectable conduct, establishing private reporting channels for harassment and discrimination, ensuring prompt and appropriate action is taken, honouring and recognizing the accomplishments of women in a variety of fields to encourage and motivate others, empowering women by providing career counselling.

❖ **Josephites in the Community (JIC)**

Parallel to the intellectual pursuits, the creation of a just society respecting the individual dignity, nurturing secular values and religious harmony and reaching out to the needy without any discrimination predicate our institutional ethos. A social concern is developed through the extension programme of the institution known by the name JIC (Josephites in the Community).

❖ **Harnessing Optimism and Potential through Education (HOPE)**

It is an extension activity initiated by the institution in 2015 and it is meant to cater to the needs of the Government Children’s Home (Girls), Kakanad, Ernakulam, a rehabilitation center for children (Girls) in need of care and protection. The children of the home have very low self-esteem and have a number of emotional problems.





## NSS

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a government-sponsored program aimed at inculcating the spirit of social service and community development among young students. St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam, established its NSS unit in the year 2022 with a total of 50 dedicated members. The unit, identified by the code 247, embarked on various activities throughout the academic year to contribute to the betterment of society.



## **STUDENTS' UNION**

The student community has a Student Union elected by the students who play a lead role in organizing and conduct of various activities for students. They meet on a regular basis and chalk out plans for the various cultural and sports activities. They also provide the necessary support for the smooth conduct of the various programmes by deploying students into various committees.

## RESULT

The results of B.Ed Batch 2021-2023 & M.Ed Batch 2021-2023 were remarkable this year with 16 B Ed. and two M.Ed. Students finding place in the University rank list within tenth position. We are proud to announce that Ms .Theresa Thankachan bagged the first rank in M. G university with the highest score. Of the 96 B.Ed students who appeared 75 students achieved A+ grade, 17 A grades and only 4 received B grade. Ms Elsa Susan Kurian of M.Ed 2021-2023 secured 2 ranks in the University Exam. Out of the 11 M.Ed. Students who appeared 2 students achieved A+, 6 A and 3 B+. This success reflects the collective efforts of students, faculty, and staff of the institution. It is a moment of pride and celebration for the entire St. Joseph College of Teacher Education community. The Alumnae Awards Day and Convocation was held on 6<sup>th</sup> March 2024 when all the achievers were honoured.

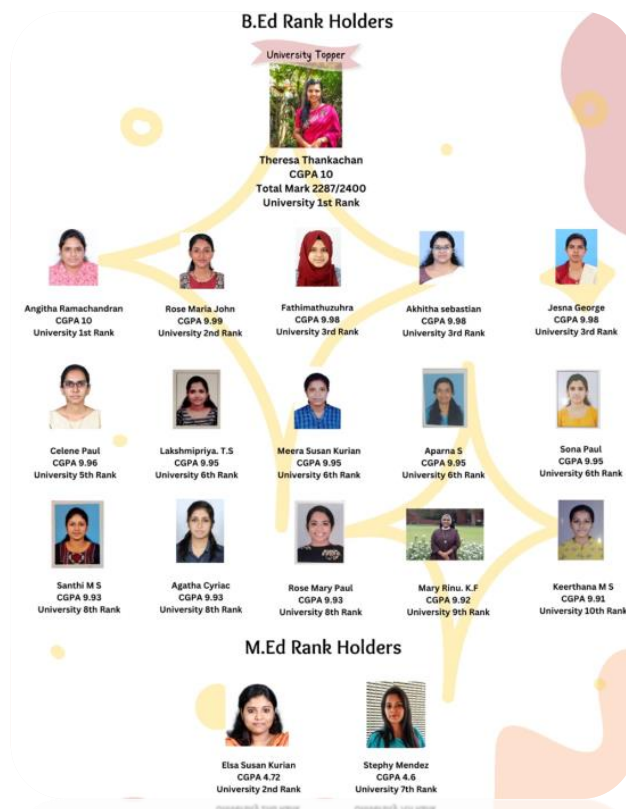
